Important Wins: The 2001-02 women's basketball team beat three NCAA Division II teams for the first time in DWU history. Those teams included Augustana College (60-51), the University of South Dakota (62-61) and Northern State University (70-54). The average margin of victory was 8.5 points per game.

NAIA National Tournament Records: Randi Morgan

Randi Morgan is the second leading women's collegiate scorer in South Dakota history with 2,557 points. She missed the state scoring record by only 26 points. Morgan is the all-time South Dakota leading rebounder with 1,544. She was the first DWU women's player to be named All-GPAC all four seasons and All-American for three seasons. Morgan was the fourth player in DWU history (men and women) to surpass 2,000 career points. She is currently ranked fourth in scoring among men and women.

Other Highlights

- The 1992-93 women's team was the first to lose fewer than 10 games in a season.
- Connie Nelson was the first women's basketball player to score more than 1,000 points in a career. There are now 29 players who have reached this milestone.
- The 1980-81 team is the only DWU athletic team to play in Europe. They made the trip in June 1981 to play in Switzerland, Belgium, Netherlands, West Germany and France.
- Ronda Morgan, Randi Morgan, Emily Janssen, Victoria Drefs, Kim Johnson, Celeste Beck, Erica Herrold, twin sisters Ashley Bray and Amber Bray, Sarah Carr, Kynedi Cheeseman, Rylie Osthus and Matti Reiner were selected as NAIA All-Americans.
- The 2008-09 DWU women's team pulled off one of the biggest upsets in school history when it took down third-ranked Northwestern College (Iowa) 75-66 on Feb. 11, 2009, at the Corn Palace.
- In 2011-12, sophomore Amanda Hart led both the GPAC and the NAIA in total 3-pointers and 3-pointers per game almost the entire season.
- In 2012-13, the DWU women experienced their most successful season in a decade. For the first time since 2003-04, the Tigers won 20 games, were ranked in the NAIA Top 25 Coaches' Poll, had an All-Conference First-Team selection and an All-American at the end of the season.
- DWU's biggest win of the year came on Jan. 20, 2013, when it upset No. 2 Concordia University 72-61 at the Corn Palace.
- On Feb. 12, 2014, almost five years to the day after upsetting Northwestern in 2009, the DWU women did it again. The Tigers beat the Red Raiders – ranked No. 3 in the NAIA – 97-76 at the Corn Palace in their biggest win of the year.
- After being picked to finish eighth in the GPAC coming into the season, the 2015-16 team finished tied for second, reached the GPAC Tournament title game and made the Elite 8 of the NAIA National Tournament.
- The 2017-18 team was the first team in DWU history to win a team national championship. The Tigers won the 2018 NAIA Division II Women's Basketball Championship against No. 2 Concordia University 82-59.
